As of 1 January 2017, Tasmania introduced new laws concerned with regulating building and plumbing work, licensing of people in the building industry and residential building contracts. These new changes take a risk-based approach to building approvals and allow for low risk, notifiable and permit categories of building, plumbing and demolition work with varying requirements at each level.
