



Design Forum - Antarctic Interiors - Miranda Nieboer

Miranda Nieboer is a Dutch architect and worked for renowned practices such as Ton Venhoeven CS. and Mecanoo Architects. Her ongoing interest in spaces and people in extreme environments, developed through independent practice based research, brought her to Tasmania.

Currently Miranda is a PhD candidate at UTAS and a recipient of a 2015 Tasmania Graduate Research Scholarship and Elite Research Scholarship. Her interdisciplinary research 'Antarctic Interiors' explores the notion of interior(ity) in the extreme context of Antarctica.

On invitation of the French Polar Institute (IPEV) Miranda joined the RAID63 to supply the French-Italian station Concordia in the Antarctic interior. She drove tractor in a small convoy towing tanks, containers and living units for 1100 km to Concordia.

This cold and long ride offered a unique opportunity to explore various interiors on different scales: the tractor cabin, the mobile living units, the more permanent interiors of the research station, the vast space of the continental interior and the personal experiences of the RAID63 team.
